Pretend play in early childhood classrooms is a vital component of learning and development, fostering creativity, social skills, and problem-solving abilities. Through imaginative scenarios, children explore different roles and perspectives, enhancing their communication and cooperation with peers. This form of play not only stimulates cognitive growth but also helps children process their emotions and experiences in a safe environment. By incorporating elements like costumes, props, and thematic areas, educators create rich opportunities for children to engage in meaningful, hands-on learning that supports their overall development.

F.A.S.T. PM 1--Next Steps

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.) using Star Early Literacy, Progress Monitoring 1 (PM1) was administered from **8/14-9/26**. As outlined in **Weekly Briefing # 48435** Pre-K teachers should begin scheduling parent-teacher conferences to discuss the **Star Parent Report.** Parent-teacher conferences should be completed **by 10/24** and documented using the **VPK Parent Report and Conference Log.** Any VPK student who has not completed FAST testing must be assessed, as soon as they appear in the Renaissance platform, even though the PM1 window has closed. Student data is essential for identifying individual strengths and areas for academic growth. While Progress Monitoring Plans (PMPs) are not required at this time, teachers should begin providing targeted support for students who scored in the red category (below the 10th percentile).



All students who score below the 40th Percentile Ranking **OR** or are exempt from taking FAST Star Early Literacy are eligible for the **New Worlds Reading Initiative** (NWRI) Book Distribution. Each month during the school year, eligible children receive a free book tailored to their interests.

Online VPK Application Toolkit

How Structure And Routines Support Student Engagement



A well-structured early childhood classroom, built upon consistent routines, is essential in young children's development. It provides a sense of security, promotes self-regulation, and maximizes learning opportunities by creating a predictable environment where children can thrive and confidently navigate their day-to-day activities.

Key Elements of a Structured Classroom:

- Visual Schedule--Daily Routine cards should be at eye-level and as segments of the day are completed, cards should be removed to show the passing of time.
- Defined and Organized Centers--This allows children to explore independently to gather the materials needed for their plan while still having
- Classroom Helpers--Throughout the day, students should all help to make the classroom run efficiently. Students should be doing a majority of the tasks with support from adults if needed.
- Flexible Seating--While students can sit in a way that supports their autonomy, the goal is for them to be engaged in the lesson. Small groups should be assigned but there is freedom in where the students sit at small group.







CLASS Instructional Support **Teacher Tips:**

Concept Development:

- Intentionally sustain interactions that deepen and expand understanding.
- Connect new information to what they have already learned or experienced.

Quality of Feedback:

- Focus on the process of learning rather than getting the "right answer."
- Provide specific information to help clarify incorrect responses.

Language Modeling:

- Encourage children to talk to one another.
- Connect new vocabulary to familiar words...make it relatable.

Attendance Reminder

All VPK Providers are required to complete a VPK Child Attendance and Parental Choice Certificate (Long Form) for every VPK student, every month. A parent must be sign the form in **BLUE INK no** later than the 5th day of the following month. Additionally, a monthly electronic attendance record must be printed from PF7 in DSIS and attached to eachstudent's form.

Big and round




I'm glad you live upon the ground. I'm glad you don't live in a tree. Because if you did, You'd fall down on me.
