

#### **NEW LOTTERY PROCESS FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR!**

Miami-Dade County Public Schools will begin accepting 2025-2026 VPK applications beginning on January 21, 2025. Applications will be accepted through March 7, 2025. This year, all VPK lottery applications will be **exclusively accepted online** via the M-DCPS Parent Portal. Families will need to sign into the M-DCPS Parent Portal using their Google or Apple ID, regardless of whether they have a child currently enrolled in one of our schools. More information and flyers are forthcoming.

#### Tips:

- Designate a staff member to support parents who come to register their child at your school site.
- Make sure to have parents begin the application process at the school site.

#### PM2 Parent Conferences

Many of you have already started your PM2 Parent Conferences. The VPK Parent Report and Conference Log is a required document that needs to be completed during PM1, PM2, and PM3. Before meeting with families, check each child's Waterford data and usage. This information can be used to encourage Home Access and the use of the Learning Together monthly calendar. Finally, don't forget to include, VPK Families, a one-pager with strategies and resources to support families during the parent conferences.







### **PMP Requirements and Next Steps**

As communicated through Weekly Briefing # 45384, beginning this school year, all VPK students who score below the 24th percentile on the FAST Star Early Literacy PM2 assessment, must have a Progress Monitoring Plan (PMP)developed within 45 days of the assessment. The Early Focus training the importance of early intervention and the need to provide targeted support to students whose data for PM2 is in the Yellow or in the Red. For these students, a PMP must be implemented.
